Purpose of the Position

The primary purpose of the role is to build the teaching and research profile within the Faculty of Health. This will be achieved through creating, developing, and managing effective systems and processes and enhancing relationships with placement facilities in collaboration with the academic team members and employees.

The Lecturer/ Senior Lecturer in Speech Pathology will contribute to the Speech Pathology (and related) programs across the Faculty, including the development of new and innovative programs/units. This position will be involved in the development and teaching of units (courses), utilising both on-campus and flexible-mode of teaching and learning support, and to engage in scholarly work that informs teaching and learning in diverse educational contexts. The post will offer scholarship and leadership within their discipline leading to improved student experience and outcomes.

This role will make a contribution to the discipline at both the Territory and national level, which may include playing a significant role within the profession, industry group or discipline. In both scholarship, teaching and research the role will foster excellence and make original contributions, which expand knowledge or practice in their discipline.

Duties

- Develop, teach, support the administration of, and coordinate units and courses providing an engaging learning experience to foster student retention and outcomes.
- Participate in internal and external accreditation and quality improvement activity related to units and courses including core clinical speech pathology units and courses for the Faculty in area of expertise, contributing to the creative development of the discipline in a coordinated and collegial fashion.
- Be involved in developing and implementing practice education through support development of supervision skills in practice education supervisors and engaging in the development, maintainance, and review a process for organizing placements for students.

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- Contribute to the ongoing development of the Faculty as a flexible and responsible provider of highquality teaching and learning in a competitive education market.
- Liaise with relevant stakeholders in relation teaching and professional teams, academia, industry relationship management and research activity.
- Participate in University committees and community activities as required.
- Attend Faculty meetings and meet with discipline staff on a regular basis to discuss issues such as lecture/tutorial exercises and unit content.
- Maintain and enhance standing as an academic through professional academic development activities and as a Speech Pathology holding and maintaining professional registration and abiding by and demonstrating proficiency related to the professions code of conduct, and competency standards.
- Actively promote and engage with CDU Values and comply with The Code of Conduct.

Additional Duties at Level C

- Coach and mentor developing academics within area of discipline.

- Practice experience in providing clinical speech pathology services, including supervision relevant to the units within the Speech Pathology program.
- Ability to work collaboratively in the development of appropriate programs to develop subjects and learning materials for on-line and hybrid delivery.
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively as part of a team, including an understanding of the importance of contributing to staff meetings, discipline, and university committees.
- Demonstrated high level interpersonal, verbal, and written communication skills with well-developed time management and organizational skills.
- Demonstrated experience in education, clinical abdication and post graduate reaching qualification or demonstrated interest and desire to obtain post-graduate teaching qualifications.
- Ability to forge strong collaborative links and contribute to the growth of the profession in the region.
