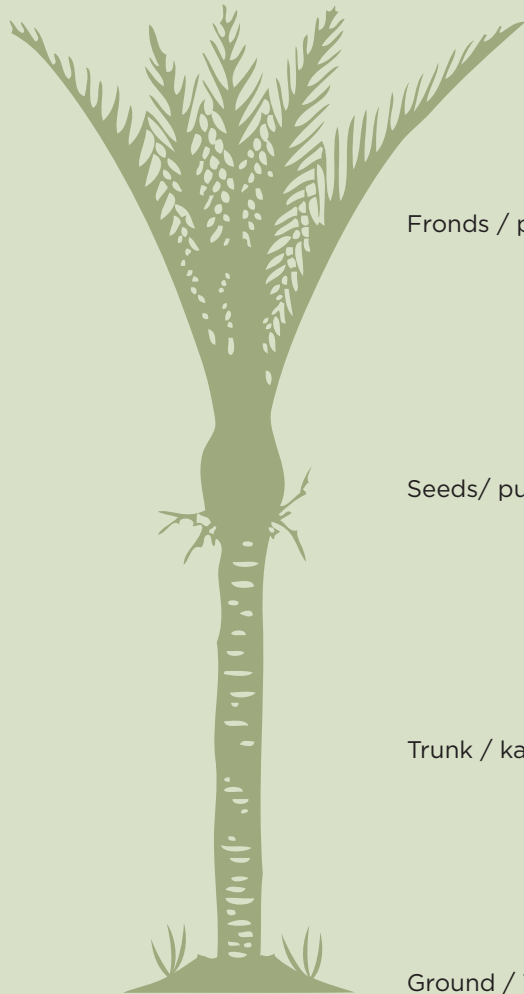
**The New Zealand Speech-language
